

## DIVISION L - CONSUMER & FAMILY SCIENCE

### Division Rules & Regulations:

1. Only 4-H Members may exhibit in this division. Exhibitors may only enter 1 exhibit per class.

Pre-entry is required. **YOU MUST USE THE INTERNET ENTRY SYSTEMS FOUND AT [www.marylandstatefair.com](http://www.marylandstatefair.com) Internet entries are due July 31st.** Exhibitors without internet access should contact their County Extension Educator for assistance. All release forms are to be completed online through the entry system at time of registration.

2. Exhibitors and exhibits must comply with the "General State Fair Rules & Regulations", "General 4-H and FFA Rules & Regulations", these "Division Rules & Regulations" and the applicable "Section Rules & Regulations".
3. All exhibits must be clean and free of labels and tags, unless otherwise specified in the section rules or class description.
4. **Judging:** All exhibits will be judged on their own merit and receive a rating of Excellent, Very Good or Good. The Judges will then at their own discretion give placings up to 10<sup>th</sup> Place in each class. Unless otherwise noted in section, exhibits will be judged in one of the 4-H Age Divisions: Junior (ages 8-10 as of 1/1/22); Intermediate (ages 11-13 as of 1/1/22); Senior (ages 14-18 as of 1/1/22). Entries not conforming to class description and/or division/section rules & regulations will be disqualified.
5. **Awards:** Ribbons will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> Place exhibits in each class. Premiums: 1<sup>st</sup> (\$7), 2<sup>nd</sup>–10<sup>th</sup> (\$5). Rosettes will be awarded to the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Champions and Reserve in each section, if there are sufficient entries as determined by the Superintendent.
6. Entries for this division will be received Tuesday, August 23rd from 2pm to 8pm in the 4-H/FFA Home Arts Building and released Monday, September 12th from 9am to 7pm. An early-bird release period will be made available on Sunday, September 11th from 8pm to 10pm AFTER the building is closed to the public.

### Section Rules & Regulations:

1. Exhibitors must be enrolled in the Caring for Children Project (Unit 1 or 2) for the current year. All entries must be the work of the Exhibitor and completed between September 2021 and August 2022. Note: "original design" means not from a kit.
2. Judging Criteria: safety; age appropriateness; educational value.
3. **All entries (with the exception of first aid kits) MUST include a 3"x5" index card with the age of the child that the item is intended for AND the educational value of the item. Entries without this card will be considered incomplete.**

### Section Rules & Regulations:

1. Exhibitors must be enrolled in a 4-H Clothing Project for the current year. Exhibitors may only exhibit in a class designated for their age division. Classes with age restrictions have the age restriction listed in parentheses.
2. All entries must be the work of the Exhibitor and completed between September 2021 and August 2022. **All entries must be sewn.**
3. **All garments must be entered on wire hangers or plastic hangers with rotating hooks; plastic tube hangers are not allowed.** Exhibitors must provide their own hangers. Remove any protective covering/ plastic before entering garment; entries will be covered with plastic following judging.
4. Judging criteria: quality of workmanship; coordination of fabric, pattern, notions, intended use; cleanliness; personal creativity
5. Group Entries must be entered under the name of only one of the group members.
6. Please do not include patterns, plastic or ribbons from other fairs. They will not be returned.
7. Suggestions for new classes are welcomed. Please provide at either check in or pick up during State Fair.

#### Section Rules & Regulations:

1. An Exhibitor may exhibit in a class above their age level, but not below.
2. All entries must be the work of the Exhibitor and completed between September 2021 and August 2022, except for Bedspread, Quilt or Comforter class.
3. At the discretion of the judges, entries will be disqualified if they are not considered functional items used in a home environment. Craft/wooden items are not allowed in this section.
4. Judging criteria: quality of workmanship; usefulness/functional home use items; color and design application; personal creativity; cleanliness.
5. Framed pictures must be ready to hang on the wall or stand independently on a solid surface. Taped hangers are not acceptable.
6. A wall hanging is a free flowing, flat fabric based on original or pattern creation. It is intended to be suspended by a rod or dowel. Usually layers of fabric are applied to develop the design. A wall hanging is meant to be seen from a distance either inside or outside and to serve as an accessory to the home or room. Embellishments include beads, feathers, and other items that serve to enhance the overall fabric design. All wall hangings should have a rod pocket, extender tabs or rings for hanging.
7. Group Entries must be entered under the name of only one of the group members.
8. Store-bought pillows will not be accepted. **ALL PILLOWS MUST BE HANDMADE**

### Section Rules & Regulations:

1. The Exhibitor must be enrolled in the 4-H Entrepreneurship Project for the current year. Each entry must be the work of the 4-H member's Entrepreneurship Project. The Entrepreneurship Project Record must accompany each entry.
2. Individual entries will be judged at the appropriate Exhibitor 4-H Age Division.
3. Group entries are made by a team with a maximum of 5 members. Juniors may serve on an Intermediate or Senior Team; Intermediates may serve on a Senior Team. The age of the oldest team member will determine the age division of the team.
4. Judging Criteria (**Please Include**): Business Plan and Records; Financial Records; Target Markets; Management; Quality of product/service.
5. The display may range in size from 28"W x 14"D x 22"H to 36"W x 17"D x 42"H. The display must be sturdy enough to stand alone. Graphs, charts, information table, photographs, drawings, etc. may be used in the display.
6. Group entries must be entered under the name of only one of the group members.

2. Only one entry may be made by an individual or mixed group. Individual exhibitors may also participate as a member of a group.
3. Exhibitors must use a standard display board approximately (32"W x 17"D x 42" H) and creatively address the criterion. Pictures may be included.
4. Exhibit Criterion (**Please Include**): Community needs addressed; Collaborative efforts/partners; Structured reflection time; Application of skills and knowledge; Term or length of the project; Leadership and team efforts; Life skills developed; Accomplishments (include a one page summary).
5. Group entries must be entered under the name of only one of the group members.
