

## DIVISION S – AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES

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### Division Rules & Regulations:

- 4-H and FFA Members may exhibit in this division. Exhibitors may only enter 1 exhibit per class. **All exhibits must be pre-entered. YOU MUST USE THE INTERNET ENTRY SYSTEMS FOUND AT [www.marylandstatefair.com](http://www.marylandstatefair.com). Internet entries are due by July 31st, 2022.** Exhibitors and exhibits must comply with "General State Fair Rules & Regulations", "General 4-H and FFA Rules & Regulations", "Maryland Guidelines for Exhibiting & Judging Agricultural Products", these "Division Rules & Regulations" and the "Section Rules & Regulations" for the applicable section.
- All exhibits must be clean and free of labels and tags, unless otherwise specified in the section rules or class description. All entry tags must be attached to entries before taking to the Department for entry. No substitutions for classes will be accepted.
- Judging:** All exhibits will be judged on their own merit and receive a rating of Excellent, Very Good or Good. The Judges will then at their own discretion give placings up to 10<sup>th</sup> Place in each class. Unless otherwise noted in section, exhibits will be judged in one of the 4-H Age Divisions: Junior (ages 8-10 as of 1/1/22); Intermediate (ages 11-13 as of 1/1/22); Senior (ages 14-18 as of 1/1/22). Entries not conforming to class description and/or division/section rules & regulations will be disqualified.
- Awards:** Ribbons will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> Place exhibits in each class. Premiums: 1<sup>st</sup> (\$7), 2<sup>nd</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> (\$5). Rosettes will be awarded to the Junior, Intermediate and Senior Champions and Reserve Champions in each section, if there are sufficient entries as determined by the Superintendent.
- Entries for this division will be received Tuesday, August 23rd from 2pm to 8pm in the 4-H/FFA Home Arts Building and released Monday, September 12th from 9am to 7pm. An early-bird release period will be made available on Sunday, September 11th from 8pm to 10pm AFTER the Building is closed to the public.**

### SECTION 1 – FRUIT & VEGETABLE VARIETIES

#### Section Rules & Regulations:

- All exhibits must have been grown by the Exhibitor. **Classes with an (\*) require exhibit to be labeled with variety name.** Quantity of items is indicated in parentheses. Number of specimens should demonstrate consistency for the variety and make an adequate display.
- A Champion Vegetable Gift Basket award recipient will be selected from Gift Basket entries (classes S1016, S2016, S3016).

- All exhibits must have been grown by the Exhibitor. **Classes with an (\*) require exhibit to be labeled with variety name.** Quantity of items is indicated in parentheses. – Herb bunches are 6 stalks placed in water in a container.
- For Herbs Entries: Leaves should be removed below the water line.

**SECTION 3 – GRAIN**

**Section Rules & Regulations:**

- Exhibits shall consist of one quart of grain in a clear glass jar with a lid. Jars must be free of printing, labels, and advertisements. **A 3" x 5" card must be attached to the exhibit with string or tape; the following information must be printed on the card:**
  - Variety (e.g. Potomac Wheat)
  - Was the seed "certified"?
  - How much nitrogen was applied? On what date?
  - What crop was grown on this land last year?
  - Intended use (e.g. used on farm, saved for seed, sold, other – indicate what).

**SECTION 4 - HAY**

**Section Rules & Regulations:**

- Hay must be cured below 20% moisture. Alfalfa, clover or lespedeza hay with more than 10% grass will be classified as mixed. Exhibits shall consist of a bundle approximately 18" x 18" x 6" in size. Bundle must be securely tied 4 ways for hanging. **A 3" x 5" card must be attached to the exhibit with string or tape; the following information must be printed on the card:**
  - Variety and Species (e.g. WL323 Alfalfa, Benchmark Orchardgrass) – if mixed, indicate main composition.
  - Was the seed "certified"?
  - Date of seeding (month/year).
  - Which cutting? (e.g. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, etc.)
  - What crop was grown on this land last year?
  - Intended use (e.g. used on farm, saved for see, sold, other – indicate what).

## SECTION 5 - STRAW

### **Section Rules & Regulations:**

1. Straw must be cured. Exhibits shall consist of a bundle approximately 18" x18" 6" in size. Bundle must be securely tied 4 ways for hanging. **Attach a 3"x5" card to the exhibit with string or tape. The following information must be printed on the card:**
  - a. Variety and Species
  - b. Was seed "certified"
  - c. Date of seeding (month/year)
  - d. What crop was grown on this land last year?
  - e. Intended us (e.g. used on farm, saved for seed, sold, other-indicate)

## SECTION 6 - WOOL

### **Section Rules & Regulations:**

1. Exhibitors may enter a wool fleece from an animal owned by the exhibitor at time of shearing. The fleece must have been shorn in 2021. Fleeces entered by breed should be shorn from an animal clearly represented by that breed. A commercial fleece may be from any sheep. A yearling fleece may have 16 months growth.
2. Fleece should be rolled properly- flesh side out and tied with paper twine, in such a way as to allow adequate handling, yet not affect the character or attractiveness. **Each entry must be tagged with: Exhibitor's Name, address, breed, sex, number of month's growth.**

## SECTION 7 - HONEY

### **Section Rules & Regulations**

1. All honey and wax must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been produced by exhibitor within a 15-month period prior to entry.
2. All honey exhibited must have been gathered and ripened in a natural way by honeybees.
3. Exhibitor's name or label will not be allowed on any entry.
4. Judges may remove from public view any entry or part thereof which, in their opinion, discredits the exhibit.
